- (a) "Authorization" means the informed and written consent of the person whose DNA is to be extracted or analyzed, or the informed and written consent of the person's legal guardian or authorized representative.
- (b) "DNA analysis" means the medical and biological examination and analysis of a person to identify the presence and composition of genes in that person's body. The term includes DNA typing and genetic testing.
- (c) "DNA sample" means any human biological specimen from which DNA can be extracted, or the DNA extracted from such specimen.
 - (2) It is unlawful for a person to willfully, and without

authorization, collect or retain another person's DNA sample with the intent to perform DNA analysis. A person who violates this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

- (3) It is unlawful for a person to willfully, and without authorization, submit another person's DNA sample for DNA analysis or to conduct or procure the conducting of another person's DNA analysis. A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083 or s. 775.084.
- (4) It is unlawful for a person to willfully, and without authorization, disclose another person's DNA analysis results to a third party. A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083 or s. 775.084.
- (5) Each instance of collection or retention, submission or analysis or disclosure in violation of this section constitutes a separate violation for which a separate penalty is authorized.
- (6) This section does not apply to a DNA sample, a DNA analysis, or the results of a DNA analysis used for the purposes of:
 - (a) Criminal investigation or prosecution;
