A bill to be entitled

An act relating to drinking water in public schools; providing legislative findings; requiring the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) to conduct a study of the prevalence and effects of lead in drinking water in public schools; specifying the information that must be included in the study; requiring OPPAGA to consult with district school boards, district boards, and other interested entities; requiring OPPAGA to submit the study to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date; providing for future repeal; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

## Section 1. (1) The Legislature finds that:

- (a) The adverse health effects of lead exposure in children and adults are well documented and no safe blood-lead level in children has been identified;
- (b) Lead accumulates in the body and can be ingested from various sources, including water sources used for drinking, food preparation, or cooking; and
- (c) All sources of lead should be controlled or eliminated to prevent childhood lead poisoning.
- (2) The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) shall conduct a study of the prevalence and effects of lead in drinking water in public schools.
  - (3) The study must include all of the following

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information: (a) The effects of lead on the health, growth, and mental development of children. (b) The financial impact on the state due to the effects of lead on the health, growth, and mental development of children. (c) How much each school district is affected by lead in school drinking water arranged by most affected to least affected. (d) The cost to maintain the lead pipes currently used by public schools, including pipes that use lead in solder. (e) The cost for the state to provide point of use water filters certified by the American National Standards Institute to reduce lead. (4) In conducting the study, OPPAGA shall consult with district school boards, district boards as defined in s. 153.52(3), Florida Statutes, and other interested entities.

(6) This act shall stand repealed on June 30, 2022, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

(5) OPPAGA shall submit the study to the Governor, the

President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of

Representatives by January 1, 2022.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
