The council shall consist of nine members who shall be appointed 47 48 by the Secretary of State. Of the nine members, three members must represent Florida public libraries, two members must 49 50 represent the Florida Postsecondary Academic Library Network

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51	Services Cooperative, one member must represent a multitype
52	library cooperative, one member must represent a school library
53	media center, one member must represent the Independent Colleges
54	and Universities of Florida, and one member must represent a
55	Florida library professional association. Members shall be
56	appointed for 4-year terms. A vacancy on the council shall be
57	filled for the period of the unexpired term. A person may not be
58	appointed to serve more than two consecutive terms as a member

195	articulation and access pursuant to parts II and III of chapter
196	1007. The host entity is responsible for developing and
197	disseminating operational procedures and technical guidelines

(b) 208 Define and describe the catalog's search and retrieval 209 options that, at a minimum, will allow users to search by 210 academic term or course start date; institution, multiple 211 institutions, or all institutions; and course or program 212 delivery methods, course type, course availability, subject or 213 discipline, and course number or classification of instructional 214 programs number. 215 (c) An Internet-based analytic tool that allows for the 216 collection and analysis of data as to usage of resources 217 accessed or interaction with constituent institutions whose 218 courses and programs are listed in the catalog. 219 (d) Frequent review and updates to institution catalogs to 220 ensure that distance learning courses and degree programs comply 221 with operational procedures. 222 STATEWIDE ONLINE STUDENT ADVISING SERVICES AND (3) 223 SUPPORT.-The following online services and support shall be made 224 available on a statewide basis: 225 A streamlined online admissions application process, (a)

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226 which shall be used by all public postsecondary institutions, 227 for undergraduate transient students currently enrolled and 228 pursuing a degree at a public postsecondary education 229 institution who enroll in a course offered by a public 230 postsecondary education institution that is not the student's 231 degree-granting institution, which shall: 232 1. Use the transient student admissions application 233 available through the statewide computer-assisted student 234 advising system established pursuant to paragraph (b). This 235 admissions application is the only application required for 236 enrollment of a transient student as described in this 237 paragraph. 238 2. 273	electronic transfer and receipt of information and records for:

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276 Transfer of credit awarded by the institution offering с. 277 the course to the transient student's degree-granting 278 institution using the Florida Automated System for Transferring 279 Educational Records (the "FASTER System"). 280 (c) A method for identifying and evaluating new 281 technologies and instructional methods for improving distance 282 learning instruction and development for faculty, student 283 learning outcomes, student access, the efficient delivery of 284 student support services, and the overall quality of 285 postsecondary distance learning courses and degree programs. 286 Negotiation of statewide licensing resources and (d) 287 preferred pricing agreements, issuing purchase orders, and 288 entering into contracts for the acquisition of distance learning 289 resources, student and support services, electronic resources, 290 and other goods and services necessary to carry out duties under 291 this section. 292 (4) REPORTING.-Beginning December 31, 2021, and each year 293 thereafter, the host entity shall submit a report to the 294 Chancellors of the State University System and the Florida 295 College System regarding the implementation and operation of all components described in this section, including, but not limited 296 297 to, usage information collected under paragraph (2)(c), 298 information and associated costs relating to the services and 299 functions of the program, and the implementation and operation of the automated library services. The Chancellors will provide 300

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301 an annual report on the performance of the host entity in 302 delivering the services and any recommendations for changes 303 needed to this section to the Governor, the President of the 304 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Board 305 of Governors, and the State Board of Education. 306 (5) GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.-The Office of the Board 307 of Governors and the Department of Education shall have joint 308 responsibility for determining the host entity for the services 309 described in this section and shall share in the receipt and administration of an associated appropriation as described in 310 311 the General Appropriations Act. It is intended that articulated acceleration serve 358 to shorten the time necessary for a student to complete the 359 360 requirements associated with the conference of a high school 361 diploma and a postsecondary degree, broaden the scope of 362 curricular options available to students, or increase the depth 363 of study available for a particular subject.
