44 | (1) There shall be a State Library Council to advise and
 45 | assist the division with planning, policy, and priorities
 46 | related to the development of statewide information services.
 47 | The council shall consist of nine members who shall be appointed
 48 | by the Secretary of State. Of the nine members, three members
 49 | must represent Florida public libraries, two members must
 50 | represent the Florida Postsecondary Academic Library Network

 52 library cooperative, one member must represent a school library

141 (a) Provide information regarding and access to distance
 142 learning courses and degree programs offered by public

144 (b) Coordinate with the Florida College System and the
 145 State University System to identify and provide online academic
 146 support services and resources when the multi-institutional
 147 provision of such services and resources is more cost effective

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151 institutions shall use to support learning, teaching, and
152 research needs and develop automated library management tools

156 allows a user to search and, if authorized, access the aggregate
157 library holdings of the state's public postsecondary education
158 institutions. The catalog and discovery tool shall allow a user
159 to search the library holdings of one institution, selected
160 institutions, or all institutions and, to the extent feasible,
161 shall include an interlibrary loan function that ensures an
162 authorized user can access the required library holding.

163 2. An Internet-based searchable collection of electronic
164 resources which shall include, but not be limited to, full-text
165 journals, articles, databases, and electronic books licensed
166 pursuant to paragraph (d).

167 3. An integrated library management system and its
168 associated services that all public postsecondary education
169 institution academic libraries shall use for purposes of
170 acquiring, cataloging, circulating, and tracking library

188 (f) Provide appropriate help desk support, training, and
 189 consultation services to institutions and students.

190 (2) STATEWIDE INTERNET-BASED CATALOG OF DISTANCE LEARNING
 191 COURSES.—There is established a statewide Internet-based catalog
 192 of distance learning courses, degree programs, and resources
 193 offered by public postsecondary education institutions which is
 194 intended to assist in the coordination and collaboration of
 195 articulation and access pursuant to parts II and III of chapter
 196 1007. The host entity is responsible for developing and
 197 disseminating operational procedures and technical guidelines
 198 for the catalog, to be followed by all participating
 199 institutions. Operating procedures and technical guidelines will
 200 address the following:

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201 (a) Specific information concerning the distance learning
 202 course or degree program, including, but not limited to, course
 203 number, classification of instructional programs number, and
 204 information on the availability of the course or degree program;
 205 any prerequisite course or technology competency or skill; the
 206 availability of academic support services and financial aid
 207 resources; and course costs, fees, and payment policies.

208 (b) Define and describe the catalog's search and retrieval
 209 options that, at a minimum, will allow users to search by
 210 academic term or course start date; institution, multiple
 211 institutions, or all institutions; and course or program
 212 delivery methods, course type, course availability, subject or
 213 discipline, and course number or classification of instructional
 214 programs number.

215 (c) An Internet-based analytic tool that allows for the
 216 collection and analysis of data as to usage of resources
 217 accessed or interaction with constituent institutions whose
 218 courses and programs are listed in the catalog.

219 (d) Frequent review and updates to institution catalogs to
 220 ensure that distance learning courses and degree programs comply
 221 with operational procedures.

222 (3) STATEWIDE ONLINE STUDENT ADVISING SERVICES AND
 223 SUPPORT.—The following online services and support shall be made
 224 available on a statewide basis:

225 (a) A streamlined online admissions application process,

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226 which shall be used by all public postsecondary institutions,
227 for undergraduate transient students currently enrolled and
228 pursuing a degree at a public postsecondary education
229 institution who enroll in a course offered by a public
230 postsecondary education institution that is not the student's
231 degree-granting institution, which shall:

232 1. Use the transient student admissions application
233 available through the statewide computer-assisted student
234 advising system established pursuant to paragraph (b). This
235 admissions application is the only application required for
236 enrollment of a transient student as described in this

239 transient student admissions application process.

240 3. Transfer credit awarded by the institution offering the
241 course to the transient student's degree-granting institution.

242 4. Provide an interface between the institutional advising
243 system and the statewide computer-assisted student advising
244 system established pursuant to paragraph (b) in order to
245 electronically send, receive, and process the transient student
246 admissions application.

247 (b) A statewide computer-assisted student advising system
248 which shall support the process of advising, registering, and
249 capturing student progression toward a degree and career and
250 which shall include a degree audit and an articulation

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251 component. Florida College System institutions and state
252 universities shall interface institutional advising systems with
253 the statewide computer-assisted student advising system. At a
254 minimum, the statewide computer-assisted student advising system
255 shall:

256 1. Allow a student to access the system at any time.

257 2. Allow a student to search public postsecondary
258 education institutions and identify course options that will
259 meet the requirements of a selected path toward a degree.

260 3. Audit transcripts of students enrolled in a public
261 postsecondary education institution to assess current academic
262 standing, the requirements for a student to transfer to another
263 institution, and all requirements necessary for graduation.

264 4. Serve as the official statewide repository for the
265 common prerequisite manual, admissions information for
266 transferring programs, foreign language requirements, residency
267 requirements, and statewide articulation agreements.

268 5. Provide information relating to career descriptions and
269 corresponding educational requirements, admissions requirements,
270 and available sources of student financial assistance.

271 6. Provide the admissions application for transient
272 students pursuant to paragraph (a) which must include the
273 electronic transfer and receipt of information and records for:

274 a. Admissions and readmissions.

275 b. Financial aid.

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276 c. Transfer of credit awarded by the institution offering
 277 the course to the transient student's degree-granting
 278 institution using the Florida Automated System for Transferring
 279 Educational Records (the "FASTER System").

280 (c) A method for identifying and evaluating new
 281 technologies and instructional methods for improving distance
 282 learning instruction and development for faculty, student
 283 learning outcomes, student access, the efficient delivery of
 284 student support services, and the overall quality of
 285 postsecondary distance learning courses and degree programs.

286 (d) Negotiation of statewide licensing resources and
 287 preferred pricing agreements, issuing purchase orders, and

 289 resources, student and support services, electronic resources,

292 (4) REPORTING.—Beginning December 31, 2021, and each year
 293 thereafter, the host entity shall submit a report to the
