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architect's, or certified structures specialist's acts or omissions in the performance of his or her services, provided that the professional engineer, registered architect, or certified structures specialist acted reasonably and in good faith and the act did not involve gross negligence or willful misconduct.

- (2) As used in this section, the term "structures specialist" means a person who has been trained by and holds a current certificate from the United States Army Corps of Engineers as a Structures Specialist (StS).
- (3) A person who is licensed, registered, or certified in another state as an engineer, architect, or structures specialist and who voluntarily provides engineering services while participating as a member of another state's mobile support unit which is rendering aid in this state during a declared state of emergency or within 90 calendar days after the end date of the declared state of emergency is immune from liability for any personal injury, wrongful death, property damage, or other loss related to the person's acts or omissions in the performance of his or her services, provided that the person acted reasonably and in good faith and the act did not involve gross negligence or willful misconduct.
