| 35 | Section 1. Subsection (12) of section 474.202, Florida |
| 36 | Statutes, is amended, and subsection (14) is added to that |
| 37 | section, to read: |
| 38 | 474.202 Definitions.—As used in this chapter: |
| 39 | (12) "Veterinarian/client/patient relationship" means a |
| 40 | relationship where the veterinarian has assumed the |
| 41 | responsibility for making medical judgments regarding the health |
| 42 | of the animal and its need for medical treatment. <u>Such</u> |
| 43 | relationship may be established in person or by making medically |
| 44 | appropriate and timely visits to the premises where the animal |
| 45 | is kept or by means of veterinary telemedicine if audio-visual |
| 46 | technology is used to establish such relationship. |
| 47 | (14) "Veterinary telemedicine" means the practice of |
| 48 | veterinary medicine in a remote setting, including through the |

Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 97 474.203, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 474.203 Exemptions.-This chapter does not apply to: 98 (5) (a) Any person, or the person's regular employee, 99 100 administering to the ills or injuries of her or his own animals,

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including, but not limited to, castration, spaying, and 101 102 dehorning of herd animals, unless title is transferred or 103 employment provided for the purpose of circumventing this law. 104 This exemption does not apply to any person licensed as a 105 veterinarian in another state or foreign jurisdiction and 106 practicing temporarily in this state. However, except as provided in s. 828.30, only a veterinarian may immunize or treat 107 108 an animal for diseases that are communicable to humans and that 109 are of public health significance.

For the purposes of chapters 465 and 893, persons exempt pursuant to subsection (1), subsection (2), or subsection (4) are deemed to be duly licensed practitioners authorized by the laws of this state to prescribe drugs or medicinal supplies.

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474.214 Disciplinary proceedings.-

(1) The following acts shall constitute grounds for whichthe disciplinary actions in subsection (2) may be taken:

(y) Using the privilege of ordering, prescribing, or making available medicinal drugs or drugs as defined in chapter 465, or controlled substances as defined in chapter 893, for use other than for the specific treatment of animal patients for which there is a documented veterinarian/client/patient relationship. 158 The owner of every dog, cat, and ferret shall have the (C) animal revaccinated 12 months after the initial vaccination. 159 Thereafter, the interval between vaccinations shall conform to 160 161 the vaccine manufacturer's directions. The cost of vaccination 162 must be borne by the animal's owner. Evidence of circulating 163 rabies virus neutralizing antibodies may shall not be used as a 164 substitute for current vaccination in managing rabies exposure 165 or determining the need for booster vaccinations.
