A bill to be entitled

An act relating to a certified copy of documents required for restoration of voting rights; amending s. 28.24, F.S.; requiring the clerk of the circuit court to provide certain documents to certain persons without charge; amending s. 98.0751, F.S.; providing that the clerk of the circuit court shall provide certain documents to a person pursing restoration of voting rights without charge or delay; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsection (29) is added to section 28.24, Florida Statutes, to read:
- Service charges.—The clerk of the circuit court shall charge for services rendered manually or electronically by the clerk's office in recording documents and instruments and in performing other specified duties. These charges may not exceed those specified in this section, except as provided in s. 28.345.
- The clerk shall provide a certified copy of any information, indictment, judgement, or sentence requested by a person who requires such documents in order for his or her voting rights to be restored pursuant to s. 4, Art. VI of the

Section 2. Subsection (4) of section 98.0751, Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (5), and a new subsection (4) is added to that section, to read:

98.0751 Restoration of voting rights; termination of ineligibility subsequent to a felony conviction.—

(4) In the event that a person who has been disqualified from voting based on a felony conviction for an offense other than murder or a felony sexual offense is required to supply a certified copy of his or her information, indictment, judgement, or sentence in order for such disqualification to be terminated and his or her voting rights restored pursuant to s. 4, Art. VI of the State Constitution, such documents shall be provided by the clerk of the circuit court to the person without charge or delay.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
