14	WHEREAS, COVID-19 has caused or contributed to the deaths
15	of hundreds of thousands of people in the United States,
16	including tens of thousands of Floridians, and
17	WHEREAS, the Department of Health is one of the agencies
18	essential to the state's efforts to keep residents and visitors
19	safe from COVID-19, and
20	WHEREAS, duties of the Department of Health include, but
21	are not limited to, monitoring, coordinating, and administering
22	COVID-19 testing and vaccinations; compiling testing results,
23	vaccination data, and demographic information; and providing the
24	public with daily updates of such testing, vaccination, and
25	demographic data, along with any other statistical information
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26	related to COVID-19, and
27	WHEREAS, the Department of Health has partnered with
28	certain entities, including counties, to facilitate, advance,
29	and expand the reach of testing and vaccination efforts across
30	this state, and
31	WHEREAS, it is critical that certain demographic
32	information related to COVID-19 testing and vaccination be
33	measured and released at the county level, and
34	WHEREAS, providing such information at the county level
35	will allow a more effective assessment of where to establish
36	testing and vaccination sites, will enable the identification of
37	areas requiring an enhanced presence of testing or vaccination
38	sites based on aggregate data, and will ensure that testing and
39	vaccination sites are located in the areas of greatest need and
40	demand, NOW, THEREFORE,

42	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

44	Section 1. <u>COVID-19 daily data reporting</u>
45	(1) The Department of Health shall issue daily reports on
46	its website which include, at a minimum, aggregate testing and
47	vaccination data at the county level in one chart, including the
48	birth year, sex, race, ethnicity, and county of each individual
49	who is tested or vaccinated.
50	(2) The reports under subsection (1) are public records

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51	subject to s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and shall be made
52	available upon request in accordance with that section.
53	(3) This section does not authorize the release or
54	publication of personal identifying information, biometric
55	identification information, or other personal health information
56	protected under state or federal law.
57	Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section
58	408.033, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 8 of chapter

9. In conjunction with the Department of Health, plan for
services at the local level for persons infected with the human
immunodeficiency virus.

107 10. Provide technical assistance to encourage and support
108 activities by providers, purchasers, consumers, and local,
109 regional, and state agencies in meeting the health care goals,
110 objectives, and policies adopted by the local health council.

111 11. Provide the agency with data required by rule for the 112 review of certificate-of-need applications and the projection of 113 need for health services and facilities in the district.
