Section 1. Advanced Air Mobility Study Task Force.-

The Advanced Air Mobility Study Task Force, a task

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force as defined in s. 20.03(8), Florida Statutes, is created adjunct to the Department of Transportation. The task force is composed of the following members:

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(a) The secretary of the Department of Transportation or the secretary's designee, who shall serve as chair of the task

- 9. One member representing a public airport located in a county having a population of more than 1 million persons.
- 10. One member representing a public airport located in a county having a population of fewer than 1 million persons.
- (2) Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority.
- (3) Task force members shall serve without compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable and necessary per diem and travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (4) The Department of Transportation shall provide staff, assistance, and facilities as are deemed necessary for the task force to perform its duties. Funding for the task force shall be paid from the State Transportation Trust Fund.
- (5) The task force shall meet at the time and location as the chair determines. The task force shall hold public hearings and receive public comment in locations throughout this state, or by electronic means, such as teleconference, provided that a means for active participation is accommodated.
 - (6) The task force shall:
- (a) Assess and describe the current state of development of the advanced air mobility industry, specifically the deployment of eVTOL aircraft. As used in this section, the term "eVTOL aircraft" means a type of aircraft that uses electric

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power to hover, take off, and land vertically without a runway.

- (b) Identify federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, and other requirements that may impact the development of the advanced air mobility industry in this state, including the potential deployment of eVTOL aircraft and infrastructure.
- (c) Recommend any changes to state laws and regulations

 necessary to facilitate the continued development of the

 advanced air mobility industry and deployment of eVTOL aircraft

 and infrastructure in this state.
- (d) Evaluate the potential integration of advanced air mobility into local government transportation plans.
- (7) By October 1, 2023, the task force shall submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a report including the information, findings, and recommendations required pursuant to subsection (6) and any other relevant material deemed appropriate by the task force. Upon submission of the report, the task force is abolished.
 - (8) This section expires December 31, 2023.

 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
