- 29 (c) One member of the House of Representatives appointed
 30 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 31 (d) The executive director of the Florida League of Cities
 32 or the director's designee.
- 33 (e) The executive director of the Florida Association of
 34 Counties or the director's designee.
- 35 (f) The president of Space Florida or the president's
 36 designee.
- 37 (g) Appointed by the Governor:
- 38 1. Two members, each representing a different city having
 39 a population of more than 250,000 persons.
- 40 2. One member representing a city having a population of
 41 fewer than 250,000 persons.
- 42 3. One member representing a metropolitan planning
 43 organization.
- 44 4. One member representing the State University System.
- 45 5. Three members representing the advanced air mobility
 46 industry.
- 47 6. One member representing an organization in this state
 48 which advocates for persons with disabilities.
- 49 7. Two members representing the business community.
- 50 8. One member representing an organization in this state

51 which advocates for underserved transportation areas.

52 9. One member representing a public airport located in a
53 county having a population of more than 1 million persons.

54 10. One member representing a public airport located in a
55 county having a population of fewer than 1 million persons.

56 (2) Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of the
57 appointing authority.

58 (3) Task force members shall serve without compensation
59 but are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable and necessary
60 per diem and travel expenses incurred in the performance of
61 their duties as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.

62 (4) The Department of Transportation shall provide staff,
63 assistance, and facilities as are deemed necessary for the task
64 force to perform its duties. Funding for the task force shall be
65 paid from the State Transportation Trust Fund.

66 (5) The task force shall meet at the time and location as
67 the chair determines. The task force shall hold public hearings
68 and receive public comment in locations throughout this state,
69 or by electronic means, such as teleconference, provided that a
70 means for active participation is accommodated.

71 (6) The task force shall:

72 (a) Assess and describe the current state of development
73 of the advanced air mobility industry, specifically the
74 deployment of eVTOL aircraft. As used in this section, the term
75 "eVTOL aircraft" means a type of aircraft that uses electric

76 power to hover, take off, and land vertically without a runway.

77 (b) Identify federal, state, and local laws, rules,
78 regulations, and other requirements that may impact the
79 development of the advanced air mobility industry in this state,
80 including the potential deployment of eVTOL aircraft and
81 infrastructure.

82 (c) Recommend any changes to state laws and regulations
83 necessary to facilitate the continued development of the
84 advanced air mobility industry and deployment of eVTOL aircraft
85 and infrastructure in this state.

86 (d) Evaluate the potential integration of advanced air
87 mobility into local government transportation plans.

88 (7) By October 1, 2023, the task force shall submit to the
89 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the
90 House of Representatives a report including the information,
91 findings, and recommendations required pursuant to subsection
92 (6) and any other relevant material deemed appropriate by the
93 task force. Upon submission of the report, the task force is
94 abolished.

95 (8) This section expires December 31, 2023.

96 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
