(/) A registered pharmacy technician seeking to administer
vaccines under s. 465.189 must have at least 6 hours of
immunization-related training approved by the board or the
Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education that shall, at a
minimum, have curriculum of instruction concerning the safe and
effective administration of such vaccines, including, but not
limited to, potential allergic reactions to such vaccines. As a
condition of registration renewal, a registered pharmacy
technician seeking to administer vaccines under s. 465.189 must
have at least 2 hours of continuing education approved by the
board or the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education in
addition to the biennial continuing education required in
subsection (6).
Section 2. Subsections (1) , (4) , (5) , and (7) of section
465.189, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine
autoinjection
(1) In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for
Disease Control and Prevention for each recommended immunization
or vaccine, a pharmacist who is certified under subsection (7)
may administer the following vaccines to an adult within the
framework of an established protocol under a supervising
physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459. or A
registered intern or a registered pharmacy technician under the
supervision of a pharmacist who is certified under subsection

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(7) may administer the following immunizations or vaccines to an adult within the framework of an established protocol under a supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459:

- (a) Immunizations or vaccines listed in the Adult Immunization Schedule as of March 31, 2022 April 30, 2021, by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The board may authorize by rule additional immunizations or vaccines as they are added to the Adult Immunization Schedule.
- (b) Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for international travel as of March 31, 2022 April 30, 2021. The board may authorize by rule additional immunizations or vaccines as they are recommended by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for international travel.
- (c) Immunizations or vaccines licensed for use in the United States, or which have been authorized for emergency use, by the United States Food and Drug Administration as of March 31, 2022 April 30, 2021. The board may authorize by rule additional immunizations or vaccines as they are so licensed or authorized.
- (d) Immunizations or vaccines approved by the board in response to a state of emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to s. 252.36.

A registered intern who administers an immunization or vaccine

under this subsection must be supervised by a certified pharmacist at a ratio of one pharmacist to one registered intern. The board may authorize by rule the ratio of one certified pharmacist to no more than six registered pharmacy technicians, specific to the administration of vaccines.

- (4) A pharmacist may not enter into a protocol <u>under a supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or administer an immunization or vaccine under this section</u> unless he or she maintains at least \$200,000 of professional liability insurance and has completed training in administering vaccines authorized under this section.
- (5) A pharmacist administering <u>immunizations or</u> vaccines under this section shall maintain and make available patient records using the same standards for confidentiality and maintenance of such records as those that are imposed on health care practitioners under s. 456.057. These records shall be maintained for a minimum of 5 years.
- (7) Any pharmacist, or registered intern, or registered pharmacy technician seeking to administer vaccines under this section must be certified to administer such vaccines pursuant to a certification program approved by the board of Pharmacy in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Medicine. The certification program shall, at a minimum, require that the pharmacist attend at least 20 hours of continuing education classes approved by the board and the

registered intern complete at least 20 hours of coursework approved by the board. The registered pharmacy technician shall have immunization-related training and continuing education as provided in s. 465.014. The certification programs program shall, at a minimum, have a curriculum of instruction concerning the safe and effective administration of such vaccines, including, but not limited to, potential allergic reactions to such vaccines.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
