18	Section 1. Subsection (5) of section 493.6105, Florida
19	Statutes, is amended to read:
20	493.6105 Initial application for license
21	(5) In addition to the requirements outlined in subsection
22	(3), an applicant for a Class "G" license must satisfy minimum
23	training criteria for firearms established by rule of the
24	department, which training criteria includes, but is not limited
25	to, 28 hours of range and classroom training <u>conducted by in-</u>
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26 person instruction or online through a secure website of the 27 licensed school or training facility if the applicant's 28 identity, attendance, and successful completion of training are 29 verified. The applicant must report the verification to the 30 department upon completion of the training. Training is to be taught and administered by a Class "K" licensee; however, no 31 32 more than 21 hours may be conducted in an online classroom, and no more than 8 hours of such training shall consist of range 33 34 training. The department shall by rule and in accordance with s. 493.6115 establish the general content, the number of hours of 35 each subject area to be taught, the method of delivery and the 36 security protocols for online training and testing, the 37 38 reporting requirements for verification of successful completion 39 of training, and any other rules necessary for the regulation of schools or training facilities providing in-person or online 40 41 training. The department may waive the foregoing firearms 42 training requirement if: 43 The applicant provides proof that he or she is (a) 44 currently certified as a law enforcement officer or correctional 45 officer pursuant to the requirements of the Criminal Justice

46 Standards and Training Commission or has successfully completed 47 the training required for certification within the last 12 48 months.

(b) The applicant provides proof that he or she iscurrently certified as a federal law enforcement officer and has

58	(1) An online training course for a Class "D" or Class "G"			
59	license must be attached to and conducted by a licensed school			
60	or training facility that maintains a physical location.			
61	(2) A firearms instructor conducting an online training			
62	course must work under a licensed school or training facility or			
63	be employed under a business establishment registered,			
64	permitted, or licensed by the department with an insurance			
65	policy in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.			
66	(3) An applicant may only be logged into the online			
67	training course from one device at a time.

Paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 78 493.6303, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 79 493.6303 License requirements.-In addition to the license 80 requirements set forth elsewhere in this chapter, each 81 individual or agency must comply with the following additional 82 requirements: 83 (4) (a) An applicant for a Class "D" license must submit 84 proof of successful completion of a minimum of 40 hours of 85 professional training at a school or training facility licensed by the department. The training may be <u>conducted by in-person</u> 86 87 instruction or online through a secure website of the licensed school or training facility if the applicant's identity, 88 89 attendance, and successful completion of training are verified. 90 The applicant must report the verification to the department 91 upon completion of the training. The department shall by rule 92 and in accordance with s. 493.6103 establish the general content 93 and number of hours of each subject area to be taught, the 94 method of delivery and the security protocols for online 95 training and testing, the reporting requirements for 96 verification of successful completion of training, and any other 97 rules necessary for the regulation of schools or training 98 facilities providing in-person or online training. 102	prescribed by the department. The training facility or the
103	instructor must also provide a copy of the training results to
