

26 of a declared local, state, or federal emergency that is in
 27 effect within the jurisdiction of the local government;

28 2. The person notifies the local government that its
 29 failure to provide timely residential collection service was due
 30 to the emergency; and

31 3. The person provides the necessary collection service no
 32 later than 36 hours after the time when the service should have
 33 been provided.

34
 35 To obtain relief under this paragraph, the person providing
 36 collection services must demonstrate to the local government
 37 that it complied with the requirements of this paragraph.

38 (b) The local government must pay for collection services
 39 provided under subparagraph (a)3. However, the local government
 40 is not required to pay the applicable fee for a specific
 41 collection service for a residential customer until that service
 42 is provided to the customer.

43 (c) This subsection applies to contracts for the
 44 collection of residential solid waste or recyclable material
 45 that are executed or renewed after July 1, 2022.

46 (d) This subsection does not apply to:

47 1. A contract or contractual provision for the collection
 48 of storm-generated yard trash as that term is defined in s.
 49 403.703(42).

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50 2. Collections of solid waste or recyclable material
51 missed due to the fault of the person providing collection
52 services.

53 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
