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92 (9) The commissioner shall oversee and enforce compliance
93 with the requirements relating to school safety and security
94 ~~requirements of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public~~
95 ~~Safety Act, chapter 2018-3, Laws of Florida,~~ by school
96 districts; district school superintendents; and public schools,
97 including charter schools. The commissioner must facilitate
98 compliance to the maximum extent provided under law, identify
99 incidents of noncompliance, and impose or recommend to the State
100 Board of Education, the Governor, or the Legislature enforcement
101 and sanctioning actions pursuant to s. 1008.32 and other
102 authority granted under law.
