60 <u>(b)(c)</u> If a document requested from a subscriber is not 61 confidential or exempt from public records requirements, the 62 division and the contractor shall disclose to all subscribers 63 that such information submitted to verify the eligibility of 64 dependents may be subject to disclosure and inspection under 65 chapter 119.

66 <u>(c) (d)</u> A government-issued marriage license or marriage 67 certificate submitted for dependent eligibility verification 68 must include the date of the marriage between the subscriber and 69 the spouse.

70 (d) (e) A government-issued birth certificate submitted for 71 dependent eligibility verification must list the parents' names.

72 <u>(e) (f)</u> Foreign-born subscribers unable to obtain the 73 necessary documentation within the specified time period of 74 producing verification documentation may execute a signed 75 affidavit attesting to eligibility requirements.

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76 <u>(f)(g)</u> Documentation submitted to verify eligibility may 77 be an original or a photocopy of an original document. Before 78 submitting a document, the subscriber may redact any information 79 on a document which is not necessary to verify the eligibility 80 of the dependent.

81 (q) (h) All documentation obtained by the contractor to 82 conduct the dependent eligibility verification services must be 83 retained in accordance with the applicable records retention schedule until June 30, 2019. The department or the contractor 84 85 is not required to retain such documentation after June 30, 2019, and shall destroy such documentation as soon as 86 87 practicable after such date. 88 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
