23	(2) The <u>department</u> Division of State Group Insurance is
24	directed to competitively procure a contract for dependent
25	eligibility verification services for the state group insurance
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26 program; however, compensation under the contract may not exceed historical claim costs for the prior 12 months for the dependent 27 28 populations disenvolled as a result of the contractor's 29 services. 30 (a)1. By September 1, 2017, the division shall notify all subscribers regarding the eligibility rules for dependents. 31 32 Through November 30, 2017, the division must hold subscribers harmless for past claims of ineligible dependents if such 33 34 dependents are removed from plan membership before December 1, 35 2017. 36 2. 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126 (f) (g) Documentation submitted to verify eligibility may 127 be an original or a photocopy of an original document. Before 128 submitting a document, the subscriber may redact any information 129 on a document which is not necessary to verify the eligibility 130 of the dependent.

131 (q) (h) All documentation obtained by the department or 132 contractor to conduct the dependent eligibility verification 133 services must be retained in accordance with the applicable 134 records retention schedule until June 30, 2019. The department 135 or the contractor is not required to retain such documentation 136 after June 30, 2019, and shall destroy such documentation as 137 soon as practicable after such date. 138

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
