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A bill to be entitled An act relating to pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation; creating s. 383.147, F.S.; requiring the Department of Health to develop and annually update educational materials relating to pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation; providing requirements for such materials; requiring the department to post the materials on its website in a specified format; requiring hospitals, birth centers, and other statelicensed birthing facilities to provide the educational materials to parents of newborns before they are discharged; requiring such entities to post a link to such materials on their websites, if any; providing that attending health care providers at home births are responsible for providing the educational materials to the parents within a specified timeframe; amending s. 383.2163, F.S.; revising the list of telehealth services and education to be provided under telehealth minority maternity care pilot programs to include education on pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation; amending ss. 383.311 and 383.318, F.S.; requiring birth centers to educate their clients in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation before and after each birth; amending s. 395.1053, F.S.; requiring hospitals to provide the departmentdeveloped educational materials on pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation as part of their postpartum instruction on the care of newborns; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 383.147, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

383.147 Pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation education.-

- (1) The Department of Health shall develop and annually update educational materials relating to pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The materials must reflect the most current accepted medical standards and guidelines for pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and must include, at a minimum, all of the following:
- (a) An explanation of pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation, noting the differences between cardiopulmonary resuscitation for adults, infants, and children.
- (b) Examples of situations and risk factors that may increase the incidence of respiratory or cardiac emergencies in infants and children.
- (c) Information on the importance of families receiving training in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
- (d) Links to certified training courses for pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and other resources available to families for the promotion of infant and child safety.
- (e) Any other information the department deems appropriate for the promotion of infant and child safety.
- (2) The Department of Health shall post the educational materials on its website in an easily accessible format, ensuring that any links contained therein are active.
 - (3) Each hospital, birth center, or other state-licensed

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birthing facility that provides maternity and newborn care services shall, before a newborn is discharged, provide the parents of each newborn with the educational materials on pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation developed by the Department of Health under subsection (1). Each hospital, birth center, and other state-licensed birthing facility shall also make available on its website, if any, a link to the educational materials on the Department of Health's website.

(4) For home births, the attending health care provider is responsible for providing the educational materials to parents within 24 hours after a birth.

Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 383.2163, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

383.2163 Telehealth minority maternity care pilot programs.—By July 1, 2022, the department shall establish a telehealth minority maternity care pilot program in Duval County and Orange County which uses telehealth to expand the capacity for positive maternal health outcomes in racial and ethnic minority populations. The department shall direct and assist the county health departments in Duval County and Orange County to implement the programs.

- (3) TELEHEALTH SERVICES AND EDUCATION.—The pilot programs shall adopt the use of telehealth or coordinate with prenatal home visiting programs to provide all of the following services and education to eligible pregnant women up to the last day of their postpartum periods, as applicable:
- (b) Services and education addressing social determinants of health, including, but not limited to, all of the following:
 - 1. Housing placement options.

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2. Transportation services or information on how to access such services.

- 3. Nutrition counseling.
- 4. Access to healthy foods.
- 5. Lactation support.
- 6. Lead abatement and other efforts to improve air and water quality.
 - 7. Child care options.
 - 8. Car seat installation and training.
- 9. Pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including provision of the educational materials developed by the department under s. 383.147(1).
 - 10. Wellness and stress management programs.
- $\underline{11.10.}$ Coordination across safety net and social support services and programs.
- Section 3. Paragraph (g) is added to subsection (2) of section 383.311, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 383.311 Education and orientation for birth center clients and their families.—
- (2) The clients shall be prepared for childbirth and childbearing by education in:
- (g) Pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including provision of the educational materials developed by the Department of Health under s. 383.147(1).
- Section 4. Paragraph (j) is added to subsection (3) of section 383.318, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 383.318 Postpartum care for birth center clients and infants.—
- 116 (3) The birth center shall provide a postpartum evaluation

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and followup care that includes all of the following:

(j) Instruction on pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including provision of the educational materials developed by the Department of Health under s. 383.147(1).

Section 5. Section 395.1053, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

395.1053 Postpartum education.—A hospital that provides birthing services shall incorporate information on safe sleep practices and the possible causes of Sudden Unexpected Infant Death into the hospital's postpartum instruction on the care of newborns and provide to each parent the informational pamphlet on infant and childhood eye and vision disorders created by the department under pursuant to s. 383.14(3)(i) and the educational materials on pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation developed by the department under s. 383.147(1).

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
