(4) Employees of covered providers must receive uniform 97 98 training about Alzheimer's disease and related forms of dementia 99 as follows:

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100	(a) Upon beginning employment, each employee must receive

(e) For an assisted living facility, adult family-care home, or adult day care center that advertises and provides, or is designated to provide, specialized care for individuals who have Alzheimer's disease or related forms of dementia, in addition to the training specified in paragraphs (a) and (b), employees must receive the following training: 1. Within 3 months after the date of beginning employment,

1461. Within 3 months after the date of beginning employment,147each employee who has regular contact with or provides direct148care to residents or participants must complete an additional 3

149 hours of training in the topics set forth in paragraph (d).
