A bill to be entitled

An act relating to designation of the state bird; creating s. 15.0352, F.S.; designating the Florida scrub-jay as the official state bird; specifying that the act supersedes designation of the mockingbird as the state bird; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the Florida scrub-jay is a bird measuring from 9 to 11 inches in length with blue wings, head, and tail, a gray back and underparts, and a whitish forehead and neck, and

WHEREAS, protected by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, the Florida scrub-jay is also protected as a threatened species by the federal Endangered Species Act and as a federally designated threatened species by the Florida Endangered and Threatened Species Rule, and

WHEREAS, the Florida scrub-jay is the only bird species endemic to the State of Florida, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 15.0352, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

15.0352 Official state bird.—The Florida scrub-jay (Aphelocoma coerulescens) is designated as the official Florida state bird.
