30 If the Legislature has approved 135 150 or more (b) 31 specialty license plates, the department may not issue any new 32 specialty license plates until a sufficient number of plates are 33 discontinued pursuant to s. 320.08056(8) such that the number of 34 plates being issued does not exceed 135 150. Notwithstanding s. 35 320.08056(8)(a), the 135-license-plate 150-license-plate limit 36 includes license plates above the minimum sales threshold and 37 those exempt from that threshold.
