105 (1) The management, maintenance, and upkeep of the Capitol Center as described defined in s. 272.03, are hereby vested in 106 107 and made the direct obligation of the Department of Management Services, which shall have authority to do all things necessary 108 109 to satisfactorily accomplish these functions, including the employment of a superintendent of grounds and buildings and 110 other employees; the establishment of central repair and 111 112 maintenance shops; and the designation or appointment of 113 nonsalaried advisory committees to advise with them.

114 (2) By December 1, 2022, and annually thereafter, the 115 Department of Management Services shall submit to the Governor, 116 the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 117 Representatives a Capitol Center maintenance and upkeep report. 118 The report must describe the Capitol Center maintenance and 119 repairs provided in the prior year and planned for the upcoming year and must include the costs of prior repairs and cost 120 estimates for future repairs. The report should also describe 121 any necessary structural modifications, security improvements, 122 123 and major repairs to the buildings and grounds.

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Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
