21	persons who have disabilities. The council shall fulfill its

50	Total membership on the council may not exceed 27 at any one

However, a member who is a representative 55 56 of a state agency shall be appointed by the head of that state 57 agency. (a) Act as the board of directors of a not-for-profit corporation created by the division. Through the corporation, the council shall provide direction to <u>the Florida Florida's</u> Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology, a project sponsored by the department for the coordination and delivery of appropriate, cost-effective, state-of-the-art assistive technology services and devices.

(b) Appoint committees made up of members of the council

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101 to focus on specific issues within the council's mandate. 102 Committees may request and accept in-kind contributions of 103 personnel from public or private entities to supply such 104 staffing as the committees deem necessary to carry out their 105 individual mandates.
