8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

10	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (6) of section
11	943.0585, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
12	943.0585 Court-ordered expunction of criminal history
13	records
14	(6) EFFECT OF EXPUNCTION ORDER
15	(b) The person who is the subject of a criminal history
16	record that is expunged under this section or under other
17	provisions of law, including former ss. 893.14, 901.33, and
18	943.058, may lawfully deny or fail to acknowledge the arrests
19	covered by the expunged record, except when the subject of the
20	record:
21	1. Is a candidate for employment with a criminal justice
22	agency;
23	2. Is a defendant in a criminal prosecution;
24	3. Concurrently or subsequently petitions for relief under
25	this section, s. 943.0583, or s. 943.059;

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26	4. Is a candidate for admission to The Florida Bar;
27	5. Is seeking to be employed or licensed by or to contract
28	with the Department of Children and Families, the Division of
29	Vocational Rehabilitation within the Department of Education,
30	the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Agency for
31	Persons with Disabilities, the Department of Health, the
32	Department of Elderly Affairs, or the Department of Juvenile
33	Justice or to be employed or used by such contractor or licensee
34	in a sensitive position having direct contact with children, the
35	disabled, or the elderly;
36	6. Is seeking to be employed or licensed by the Department
37	of Education, any district school board, any university
38	laboratory school, any charter school, any private or parochial
39	school, or any local governmental entity that licenses child
40	care facilities, except that an expunged misdemeanor violation
41	of chapter 812 may be lawfully denied or may fail to be
42	<pre>acknowledged;</pre>
43	7. Is seeking to be licensed by the Division of Insurance
44	Agent and Agency Services within the Department of Financial
45	Services; or
46	8. Is seeking to be appointed as a guardian pursuant to s.
47	744.3125.
48	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
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
