17 (4) (a) The board, or the department if there is no board, 18 <u>shall may</u> issue a temporary professional license to the spouse 19 of an active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United 20 States who submits to the department:

21 1. A completed application upon a form prepared and 22 furnished by the department in accordance with the board's 23 rules;

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2. The required application fee;

3. Proof that the applicant is married to a member of the Armed Forces of the United States who is on active duty;

<u>3.4.</u> Proof that the applicant holds a valid license for the profession issued by another state, the District of Columbia, or a possession or territory of the United States, and is not the subject of any disciplinary proceeding in any jurisdiction in which the applicant holds a license to practice a profession regulated by this chapter;

<u>4.5.</u> Proof that the applicant's spouse is assigned to a duty station in this state pursuant to the member's official active duty military orders; and

5.6. Proof that the applicant would otherwise be entitled to full licensure under the appropriate practice act, and is eligible to take the respective licensure examination as required in Florida.

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(c) Each board, or the department if there is no board,

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41 shall review the results of the state and federal criminal 42 history checks according to the level 2 screening standards in 43 s. 435.04 when granting an exemption and when granting or 44 denying the temporary license.

(e) The department shall <u>waive the applicant's licensure</u> set an application fee, which may not exceed the cost of issuing the license.

(f) A temporary license expires 12 months after the date of issuance and is not renewable.

(g) An applicant for a temporary license under this subsection is subject to the requirements under s. 456.013(3)(a) and (c).

(g)(h) An applicant shall be deemed ineligible for a temporary license pursuant to this section if the applicant:

 Has been convicted of or pled nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, any felony or misdemeanor related to the practice of a health care profession;

2. Has had a health care provider license revoked or suspended from another of the United States, the District of Columbia, or a United States territory;

3. Has been reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank, unless the applicant has successfully appealed to have his or her name removed from the data bank; or

4. Has previously failed the Florida examination required to receive a license to practice the profession for which the applicant is seeking a license.

(h) (i) The board, or the department if there is no board, may revoke a temporary license upon finding that the individual violated the profession's governing practice act.
