| 82 | (d) Municipalities and counties are responsible for              |
| 83 | maintaining health advisory signs in affected beach waters and   |
| 84 | public bathing places that they own. The department is           |
| 85 | responsible for maintaining health advisory signs in affected    |
| 86 | beach waters and public bathing places owned by the state. The   |
| 87 | department may coordinate with the Department of Environmental   |
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| 88 | Protection and the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to  |
