2	A memorial to the Congress of the United States,
3	urging Congress to oppose the intrusive Internal
4	Revenue Service reporting requirements placed on
5	financial institutions included in the Biden
6	administration's tax increase proposal.

8	WHEREAS, the Biden administration's tax increase proposal
9	for fiscal year 2022 includes a number of provisions that would
10	place undue burdens on financial institutions, small businesses,
11	and law-abiding citizens, and
12	WHEREAS, one proposal seeks to increase tax payment
13	enforcement measures by requiring peer-to-peer payment
14	transaction applications as well as financial institutions to
15	annually report aggregated data on all account inflows and
16	outflows of \$10,000 or more to the Internal Revenue Service
17	(IRS), and
18	WHEREAS, the reports would also disclose whether
19	transactions involved physical cash, foreign accounts, or
20	transfers between accounts with the same owner, negatively
21	impacting the privacy rights of Americans, compliance costs, and
22	low-income communities, and
23	WHEREAS, the proposal's \$10,000 threshold for reporting
24	would ensnare many active financial institution accounts,
25	including those owned by individuals and small businesses,
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26 requiring the financial data of the majority of those accounts 27 to be sent to the IRS, an agency that experiences more than one 28 billion cyberattacks each year, and

29 WHEREAS, a June 2021 ProPublica article revealed a massive 30 leak of tax return data from the IRS, demonstrating that the 31 agency is unable or unwilling to protect taxpayer information, 32 and given its many vulnerabilities in cybersecurity, the IRS 33 should not be trusted with more private information, and

WHEREAS, by holding financial institutions responsible for data collection and reporting, the proposal would force financial institutions to increase spending on additional staffing, technology, and other resources, which could then be passed on to the depositors, thus burdening tax-compliant citizens and small businesses, and

WHEREAS, the Biden administration's tax increase proposal fails to consider cybersecurity risks and unjust burdens on lawabiding citizens, financial institutions, and small businesses, and the United States Congress should oppose this unprecedented intrusion into the privacy rights of Americans, NOW, THEREFORE,
