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A person who commits a moving violation that causes

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serious bodily injury, as defined in s. 316.1933(1)(b), to a vulnerable road user commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, and, upon conviction, shall pay a fine of not less than \$1,500, serve a minimum of 30 days of house arrest, and attend a department-approved driver improvement course relating to the rights of vulnerable road users relative to vehicles on the roadway as provided in s. 322.0261(2). The court shall also revoke the person's driver license for at least 30 days.

- the death of a vulnerable road user commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s.

 775.083, and, upon conviction, shall pay a fine of not less than \$5,000, serve a minimum of 180 days of house arrest, and attend a department-approved driver improvement course relating to the rights of vulnerable road users relative to vehicles on the roadway as provided in s. 322.0261(2). The court shall also revoke the person's driver license for at least 1 year.
- (4) For purposes of this section, the term "vulnerable road user" means any of the following:
- (a) A pedestrian, including a person actually engaged in work upon a highway, or in work upon utility facilities along a highway, or engaged in the provision of emergency services within the right-of-way.
 - (b) A person lawfully operating a bicycle, electric
