A bill to be entitled

An act relating to fee exemptions for reunited students; amending s. 1009.25, F.S.; creating a tuition and fee exemption for students who enter the custody of the Department of Children and Families after a specified age and who are reunited with their biological or legal custodians before reaching a specified age after spending at least 18 months in department custody; requiring the student to meet certain federal financial aid eligibility requirements; providing that the exemption includes fees associated with enrollment in applied academics for adult education instruction; providing that the exemption remains valid until the student reaches a specified age; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Present paragraphs (e) through (h) of subsection (1) of section 1009.25, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs (f) through (i), respectively, and a new paragraph (e) is added to that subsection, to read:

23 1009.25 Fee exemptions.—

- (1) The following students are exempt from the payment of tuition and fees, including lab fees, at a school district that provides workforce education programs, Florida College System institution, or state university:
- (e) A student who was placed in the custody of the Department of Children and Families, in either protective

9-00347B-22 2022858 30 supervision or out-of-home care, for a period of at least 18 31 months on or after his or her 14th birthday and who was reunited, before his or her 18th birthday, with the biological 32 33 or legal custodian who was the subject of the dependency 34 proceedings that resulted in the child's placement with the 35 department. The student must meet the eligibility requirements 36 for federal financial aid under 20 U.S.C. s. 1091. The exemption 37 includes fees associated with enrollment in applied academics for adult education instruction. The exemption remains valid 38 39 until the student reaches 28 years of age. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022. 40
