9	(1) At least every 5 years, each board shall arrange for
10	an educational plant survey, to aid in formulating plans for
11	housing the educational program and student population, faculty,
12	administrators, staff, and auxiliary and ancillary services of
13	the district, charter school, or campus, including consideration
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14 of the local comprehensive plan. The Department of Education shall document the need for additional career and adult 15 16 education programs and the continuation of existing programs 17 before facility construction or renovation related to career or adult education may be included in the educational plant survey 18 19 of a school district, charter school governing board, or Florida 20 College System institution that delivers career or adult 21 education programs. Information used by the Department of 22 Education to establish facility needs must include, but need not 23 be limited to, labor market data, needs analysis, and information submitted by the school district, charter school 24 25 governing board, or Florida College System institution.

(a) Educational plant survey and localized need assessment
for capital outlay purposes.—A survey recommendation is not
required when a district <u>or charter school governing board</u> uses
funds from the following sources for educational, auxiliary, and
ancillary plant capital outlay purposes:

The local capital outlay improvement fund, consisting
 of funds that come from and are a part of the district's <u>or</u>
 <u>charter school governing board's</u> basic operating budget;

43 Survey preparation and required data.-Each survey (b) shall be conducted by the board or an agency employed by the 44 45 board. Surveys shall be reviewed and approved by the board, and a file copy shall be submitted to the Department of Education or 46 47 the Chancellor of the State University System, as appropriate. The survey report shall include at least an inventory of 48 existing educational and ancillary plants, including safe access 49 50 facilities; recommendations for existing educational and 51 ancillary plants; recommendations for new educational or 52 ancillary plants, including the general location of each in 53 coordination with the land use plan and safe access facilities; 54 campus master plan update and detail for Florida College System 55 institutions; the utilization of school plants based on an 56 extended school day or year-round operation; and such other 57 information as may be required by the Department of Education. 58 This report may be amended, if conditions warrant, at the 59 request of the department or commissioner.

Required need assessment criteria for district, 60 (C) 61 charter school governing board, Florida College System institution, state university, and Florida School for the Deaf 62 and the Blind plant surveys.-Educational plant surveys must use 63 759663

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uniform data sources and criteria specified in this paragraph.
Each revised educational plant survey and each new educational
plant survey supersedes previous surveys.

The school district's and charter school governing 67 1. 68 board's survey must be submitted as a part of the district 69 educational facilities plan defined in s. 1013.35. To ensure 70 that the data reported to the Department of Education as 71 required by this section is correct, the department shall 72 annually conduct an onsite review of 5 percent of the facilities 73 reported for each school district or charter school governing 74 board completing a new survey that year. If the department's 75 review finds the data reported by a district or charter school 76 governing board is less than 95 percent accurate, within 1 year from the time of notification by the department the district or 77 78 charter school governing board must submit revised reports 79 correcting its data. If a district or charter school governing 80 board fails to correct its reports, the commissioner may direct that future fixed capital outlay funds be withheld until such 81 82 time as the district or charter school governing board has 83 corrected its reports so that they are not less than 95 percent 84 accurate.

2. Each survey of a special facility, joint-use facility, or cooperative career education facility must be based on capital outlay full-time equivalent student enrollment data prepared by the department for school districts, charter school 759663

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governing boards, and Florida College System institutions and by 89 the Chancellor of the State University System for universities. 90 91 A survey of space needs of a joint-use facility shall be based upon the respective space needs of the school districts, charter 92 93 school governing boards, Florida College System institutions, 94 and universities, as appropriate. Projections of a school 95 district's or charter school governing board's facility space needs may not exceed the norm space and occupant design criteria 96 97 established by the State Requirements for Educational 98 Facilities.

99 3. Each Florida College System institution's survey must reflect the capacity of existing facilities as specified in the 100 inventory maintained by the Department of Education. Projections 101 102 of facility space needs must comply with standards for 103 determining space needs as specified by rule of the State Board 104 of Education. The 5-year projection of capital outlay student 105 enrollment must be consistent with the annual report of capital 106 outlay full-time student enrollment prepared by the Department 107 of Education.

108 4. Each state university's survey must reflect the 109 capacity of existing facilities as specified in the inventory 110 maintained and validated by the Chancellor of the State 111 University System. Projections of facility space needs must be 112 consistent with standards for determining space needs as 113 specified by regulation of the Board of Governors. The projected 759663

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114 capital outlay full-time equivalent student enrollment must be 115 consistent with the 5-year planned enrollment cycle for the 116 State University System approved by the Board of Governors.

The district educational facilities plan of a school 117 5. 118 district and the educational plant survey of a Florida College System institution, state university, or the Florida School for 119 120 the Deaf and the Blind may include space needs that deviate from approved standards for determining space needs if the deviation 121 is justified by the district, charter school governing board, or 122 123 institution and approved by the department or the Board of 124 Governors, as appropriate, as necessary for the delivery of an 125 approved educational program.

Review and validation. - The Department of Education 126 (d) 127 shall review and validate the surveys of school districts, 128 charter school governing boards, and Florida College System 129 institutions, and the Chancellor of the State University System 130 shall review and validate the surveys of universities, and any 131 amendments thereto for compliance with the requirements of this 132 chapter and shall recommend those in compliance for approval by 133 the State Board of Education or the Board of Governors, as 134 appropriate. Annually, the department shall perform an in-depth 135 analysis of a representative sample of each survey of 136 recommended needs for five districts and five charter school 137 governing boards selected by the commissioner from among districts and charter school governing boards with the largest 138 759663

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139 need-to-revenue ratio. For the purpose of this subsection, the need-to-revenue ratio is determined by dividing the total 5-year 140 141 cost of projects listed on the district survey by the total 5year fixed capital outlay revenue projections from state and 142 143 local sources as determined by the department. The commissioner may direct fixed capital outlay funds provided from general 144 revenue or from state trust funds to be withheld from districts 145 and charter school governing boards until such time as the 146 147 survey accurately projects facilities needs.

(e) Periodic update of Florida Inventory of School
Houses.—School districts shall periodically update their
inventory of educational facilities as new capacity becomes
available and as unsatisfactory space is eliminated. The State
Board of Education shall adopt rules to determine the timeframe
in which districts must provide a periodic update.

(2) Only the district school superintendent, Florida
College System institution president, or the university
president shall certify to the Department of Education a
project's compliance with the requirements for expenditure of
PECO funds prior to release of funds.

(a) Upon request for release of PECO funds for planning purposes, certification must be made to the Department of Education that the need for and location of the facility are in compliance with the board-approved survey recommendations, that the project meets the definition of a PECO project and the 759663

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limiting criteria for expenditures of PECO funding, and that the 164 plan is consistent with the local government comprehensive plan. 165

166 (b) Upon request for release of construction funds, 167 certification must be made to the Department of Education that 168 the need and location of the facility are in compliance with the 169 board-approved survey recommendations, that the project meets 170 the definition of a PECO project and the limiting criteria for 171 expenditures of PECO funding, and that the construction 172 documents meet the requirements of the Florida Building Code for 173 educational facilities construction or other applicable codes as 174 authorized in this chapter.
