Eligible 24 projects must be related to specific job-creation or job-25 retention opportunities. Eligible uses of funds projects may 26 also include improving any inadequate infrastructure that has 27 resulted in regulatory action that prohibits economic or 28 community growth, reducing the costs to community users of 29 proposed infrastructure improvements that exceed such costs in 30 comparable communities, and improving access to and the 31 availability of broadband Internet service. Eligible uses of 32 funds shall include improvements to public infrastructure for 33 industrial or commercial sites and τ upgrades to or development 34 of public tourism infrastructure, and improvements to broadband 35 Internet service and access in unserved or underserved rural 36 communities. Improvements to broadband Internet service and 37 access must be conducted through a partnership or partnerships 38 with one or more dealers, as defined in s. 202.11(2), and the 39 partnership or partnerships must be established through a
