To qualify for issuance or renewal of a livery permit, an applicant must 24 25 provide the commission with a list of all vessels offered by the livery for lease or rent by another, have valid insurance 26 pursuant to subsection (8) (7), have an amount of United States 27 Coast Guard-approved lawful personal floatation devices on site 28 29 sufficient to accommodate the capacity of all vessels offered by 30 the livery for rent or lease by another, have on site all safety 31 equipment required by s. 327.50 and the Code of Federal 32 Regulations sufficient to equip all vessels offered by the livery for rent or lease by another, and display the information 33 34 required by paragraph (3)(f). If, before the annual renewal of 35 the permit, the information required by this subsection changes, 36 the livery must provide the commission with the updated 37 information within 10 days after the change.
