The insurance policy must provide coverage of at 83 84 least \$500,000 per person and \$1 million per event. The livery 85 shall have proof of such insurance available for inspection at the location where livery vessels are being leased or rented, or 86 87 offered for lease or rent, and shall provide to each renter the insurance carrier's name and address and the insurance policy 88 89 number. This subsection does not apply to human-powered vessels.
