6	WHEREAS, on September 15, 2022, Congressman Dean Phillips
7	introduced H.R. 8862 to the 117th Congress, also known as the
8	"Providing Real Opportunities and Lifelong Investments For
9	Everyone Act of 2022" or the "PRO-LIFE Act of 2022," which would
10	establish new, and modify existing, programs related to maternal
11	and child health, tax credits and benefits for parents and
12	caregivers, and support for child care infrastructure, and
13	WHEREAS, in a 2022 analysis of states by the United Health
14	Foundation, Florida ranked 45th for severe housing problems for
15	women and children, 46th in access to adequate prenatal care,
16	and 50th in access to preventive dental care for children, and
17	WHEREAS, in 2021, The Annie E. Casey Foundation ranked
18	Florida 42nd in economic well-being and found that 18 percent of
19	children in Florida lived in poverty and 29 percent of children
20	in Florida had parents who lacked secure employment, and
21	WHEREAS, Florida TaxWatch estimates that child care-related
22	absenteeism in the workplace costs Florida's economy more than
23	\$271 million per year, and child care-related turnover in the
24	workplace costs Florida's employers more than \$1.7 billion per

26 WHEREAS, the PRO-LIFE Act of 2022 did not pass before the 27 117th Congress adjourned and has not been reintroduced into the 28 118th Congress, NOW, THEREFORE, 29 30 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 31 32 That the people of Florida would greatly benefit from the adoption of the provisions of the PRO-LIFE Act of 2022, which 33 34 would improve the outcomes of our children, allow our families 35 to thrive, and benefit our economy by reducing the cost of child 36 care-related absenteeism and turnover. We urge the United States 37 Congress to pass these provisions as a reintroduced bill or as part of other legislation. 38

39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of State dispatch 40 copies of this memorial to the President of the United States, 41 the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the 42 United States House of Representatives, and each member of the 43 Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
