6 Between lines 2480 and 2481, insert:

7 Section 29. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the sum of \$150
 8 million in nonrecurring funds from the General Revenue Fund is
 9 appropriated to the Department of Education to assist school
 10 districts in implementing the provisions of the bill. The funds
 11 shall be placed in reserve. The Department of Education shall
 12 complete a needs assessment that identifies the required changes
 13 that must be made by each school district to convert from a
 14 three-cueing model to a model grounded in the Science of
 15 Reading. The Department of Education is authorized to submit a
 16 budget amendment requesting release of the funds pursuant to the

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17 provisions of chapter 216, Florida Statutes. Release of the
18 funds shall be contingent upon submission of a detailed spend
19 plan that is aligned with the results of the needs assessment
20 and describes how the funds requested for release will be
21 expended.

22 Section 30. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the sum of \$8
23 million in nonrecurring funds from the General Revenue Fund is
24 appropriated to the Department of Education to implement the
25 provisions of the bill. The funds shall be placed in reserve.
26 The Department of Education is authorized to submit a budget
27 amendment requesting release of the funds pursuant to the
28 provisions of chapter 216, Florida Statutes. Release of the
29 funds shall be contingent upon submission of a detailed spend
30 plan that describes how the funds requested for release will be
31 expended.
