The written request must be notarized and must 317 specify the information to be released and the party authorized 318 to receive the information. Upon receipt of the written request, 319 the custodial agency must release the specified information to 320 the party authorized to receive such information.

321 6. The exemptions in this paragraph apply to information
322 held by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of the
323 exemption.

324 7. Information made exempt under this paragraph may be
325 disclosed pursuant to s. 28.2221 to a title insurer authorized

624.10; a title insurance agent or title insurance agency as

duly admitted to practice law in this state and in good standing

331 8. The exempt status of a home address contained in the 332 Official Records is maintained only during the period when a 333 protected party resides at the dwelling location. Upon 334 conveyance of real property after October 1, 2021, and when such 335 real property no longer constitutes a protected party's home 336 address as defined in sub-subparagraph 1.a., the protected party 337 must submit a written request to release the removed information 338 to the county recorder. The written request to release the 339 removed information must be notarized, must confirm that a 340 protected party's request for release is pursuant to a 341 conveyance of his or her dwelling location, and must specify the 342 Official Records book and page, instrument number, or clerk's 343 file number for each document containing the information to be 344 released.

9. Upon the death of a protected party as verified by a certified copy of a death certificate or court order, any party can request the county recorder to release a protected decedent's removed information unless there is a related request on file with the county recorder for continued removal of the decedent's information or unless such removal is otherwise

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351 prohibited by statute or by court order. The written request to 352 release the removed information upon the death of a protected 353 party must attach the certified copy of a death certificate or 354 court order and must be notarized, must confirm the request for 355 release is due to the death of a protected party, and must 356 specify the Official Records book and page number, instrument 357 number, or clerk's file number for each document containing the 358 information to be released. A fee may not be charged for the 359 release of any document pursuant to such request. 360 This paragraph is subject to the Open Government 10. Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 361 362 repealed on October 2, 2024, unless reviewed and saved from 363 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 364 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 365 necessity that the home addresses, dates of birth, and telephone 366 numbers of current and former judicial assistants; the names, 367 home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and places of 368 employment of the spouses and children of such judicial 369 assistants; and the names and locations of schools and day care 370 facilities attended by the children of such judicial assistants be made exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 371 372 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Such identifying and 373 location information can be used as a tool to perpetrate fraud 374 against an individual or to acquire sensitive personal, 375 financial, medical, and familial information, the release of

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376	which could cause great financial harm to the individual. In the
377	course of assisting in making rulings, entering judgments,
378	imposing sentences, or reviewing cases, judicial assistants may
379	incur the ill will of litigants, the accused, the convicted, and
380	their associates and families, thus making judicial assistants
381	and their spouses and children targets for acts of revenge. This
382	risk continues after judicial assistants leave their public
383	service. Disgruntled individuals may wait until the employment
384	of a judicial assistant ends to commit an act of revenge. If
385	such identifying and location information is released, the
386	safety of current or former judicial assistants and their
387	spouses and children could be seriously jeopardized. For these
388	reasons, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity
389	that such information be made exempt from public records
390	requirements.
391	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
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
