25	the amount of his or her down payment and closing costs by a
26	maximum of 5 percent of the first mortgage loan or \$25,000,
27	whichever is less. Loans must be made available at a 0 percent
28	interest rate. The balance of any loan is due at closing if the
29	property is sold, refinanced, rented, or transferred unless
