11	WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates there will				
12	be 106,970 new cases of colon cancer and 46,050 new cases of				
13	rectal cancer in the United States in 2023, and				
14	WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health, when				
15	adjusted for age, there were 10,702 colorectal cancer incidences				
16	per 100,000 Floridians in 2019, and				
17	WHEREAS, regular screening, beginning at the age of 45, can				
18	discover colorectal cancer in its earlier stages and may				
19	increase colorectal cancer survival rates, and				
20	WHEREAS, increasing awareness and education concerning				
21	colorectal cancer can lead to significant progress in preventing				
22	and overcoming the disease, as the majority of cases have proven				
23	to be treatable and survivable, and				
24	WHEREAS, educational campaigns and efforts can provide				
25	information to the public on methods of prevention and screening
