House Resolution

A resolution designating April 13, 2023, as "FAMU Day" in Florida.

WHEREAS, Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU), Florida's only public historically black college and university (HBCU), was founded on October 3, 1887, named a landgrant institution in 1891, and designated a university in 1953, and

WHEREAS, academic components of the university consist of 98 undergraduate, graduate, postgraduate, and professional degree programs, 7 colleges, and 7 schools, including the colleges of Agriculture and Food Sciences; Education; Engineering; Law; Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences; Science and Technology; and Social Sciences, Arts, and Humanities; and the schools of Allied Health Sciences; Architecture and Engineering Technology; Business and Industry; the Environment; Graduate Studies and Research; Journalism and Graphic Communication; and Nursing, and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of President Larry Robinson, Ph.D., FAMU's twelfth president; the FAMU Board of Trustees; and faculty and staff, FAMU continues its "March Toward the Top 100 National Public Schools" and is currently ranked at 103 and has been the highest ranked public HBCU for the past 4 years

according to the *U.S. News & World Report* 2022-2023 Best Colleges rankings, and

WHEREAS, with more than 9,000 students, FAMU has experienced a record number of first-time-in-college applications, exceeding 20,000, and the admitted students for Fall 2023 currently have an average high school GPA of 3.96, and

WHEREAS, FAMU strives to elevate student success outcomes including retention and graduation rates, and in the 2021-2022 academic year awarded 2,284 degrees, and

WHEREAS, FAMU continues its commitment to community service as evidenced by receipt of a federal grant from the Department of Commerce to reduce the digital divide between FAMU's main campus and Tallahassee's Southside, and

WHEREAS, the faculty and staff of FAMU garnered a record \$75 million in research funding in 2021-2022 and led the HBCU community in nonmedical school research funding expenditures exceeding \$59 million during the same period, and

WHEREAS, with 14 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) programs, FAMU celebrates the second Rattler to be honored as an inductee into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, former FAMU Athletic Director Ken Riley, who was the Cincinnati Bengals' 1969 sixth round pick and recorded 65 interceptions in his career, the fifth most in National Football League history, and

WHEREAS, the FAMU Center for Viticulture and Small Fruit Research, by United States Department of Agriculture charter, maintains the world's most extensive muscadine grape germplasm collection and serves as one of five National Clean Plant Centers for Grapes, and, utilizing the close industry-clientele partnership, the economically feasible and accelerated breeding pipeline has allowed the release of three new patented American native grape cultivars, Floriana, Florida Onyx, and Blanc du Soleil, in the last 2 years, and

WHEREAS, the FAMU Marching 100 and the FAMU Symphonic Band Wind Ensemble perform for audiences all over the world, from Paris, France to Miami, Florida, and

WHEREAS, the FAMU Women's Volleyball team defeated a top-seed opponent for the 2022 Southwestern Athletic Conference Women's Volleyball Tournament Championship for the second year in a row, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That in recognition of Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University's contributions as an outstanding institution of higher education, April 13, 2023, is designated as "FAMU Day" in Florida.
