(b) Each residential program site established, authorized, 86 87 or designated by the department shall be considered a campus of 88 the Florida Scholars Academy. 89 (c) Students sentenced to adult facilities under chapter 944 are not eligible to enroll in the Florida Scholars Academy. 90 91 (2) The mission of the academy is to provide a free and 92 appropriate high-quality education for eligible students within 93 the juvenile justice system and to prepare students for gainful 94 employment as productive citizens upon their reentry into the community.
