Section 1. Paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section 401.465, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

401.465 911 public safety telecommunicator certification.-

- (2) PERSONNEL; STANDARDS AND CERTIFICATION. -
- (f) A 911 public safety telecommunicator certificate expires automatically if not renewed at the end of the 2-year period and may be renewed if the holder meets the qualifications for renewal as established by the department. A certificate that is not renewed at the end of the 2-year period automatically reverts to an inactive status for a period that may not exceed $\underline{6}$ $\underline{\text{years}}$ $\underline{180}$ $\underline{\text{days}}$. Such certificate may be reactivated and renewed within the $\underline{6}$ -year $\underline{180}$ -day period if the certificateholder meets all other qualifications for renewal and pays a \$50 late fee. Reactivation shall be in a manner and on forms prescribed by department rule.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
