10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

12	Section 1. Section 689.302, Florida Statutes, is created
13	to read:
14	689.302 Disclosure of flood risks to prospective
15	purchaser
16	(1) A seller must provide a purchaser of residential real
17	property with a flood disclosure summary at the time or before
18	the sales contract is executed. The flood disclosure summary
19	must be a form that contains, or is substantially similar to,
20	the following:
21	(a) A statement in conspicuous type that says, "Flood
22	Insurance: Homeowner's insurance policies do not include
23	coverage for damage resulting from floods. Please discuss the
24	need to purchase separate flood insurance coverage with your
25	insurance agent."
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	(b) The set is a second start by the seller with the fallewing
26	(b) A section completed by the seller with the following
27	questions for which the only allowable responses are "Yes" or
28	<u>"No":</u>
29	1. Are you aware of damage caused by flooding during your
30	ownership of the property?
31	2. Have you ever filed a claim for flood damage to an
32	insurance provider or accepted federal assistance for flood
33	damage?
34	3. Do you maintain flood insurance on the property?
35	(c) If the seller answers "yes" to subparagraph (b)2., the
36	seller must:
37	1. Identify each insurance provider with whom they filed a
38	claim for such flooding.
39	2. Explain the nature of all federal assistance they were
40	provided for such flooding or both.
41	(2) For the purposes of this subsection, the term
42	"flooding" means a general or temporary condition of partial or
43	complete inundation of the property caused by any of the
44	following:
45	(a) The overflow of inland or tidal waters.
46	(b) The unusual and rapid accumulation of runoff or
47	surface waters from any established water source, such as a
48	river, stream, or drainage ditch.
49	(c) Excessive rainfall.
50	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
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
