Section 409.1452, Florida Statutes, is amended 44 45 to read: 46 409.1452 Collaboration with State University System, 47 Florida College System, and Department of Education to assist 48 children and young adults who have been or are in foster care or 49 are experiencing homelessness; documentation regarding eligibility for tuition and fee exemptions.-The department shall 50 Page 2 of 10

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51 collaborate with the State University System, the Florida 52 College System, and the Department of Education to address the 53 need for a comprehensive support structure in the academic arena 54 to assist children and young adults who have been or remain in 55 the foster care system in making the transition from a 56 structured care system into an independent living setting.

57 (1)(a) Each school district program, Florida College System institution, or state university at which a student is 58 59 exempt from the payment of tuition and fees under s. 1009.25 must have, at a minimum, a knowledgeable, accessible, and 60 61 responsive employee who acts as a liaison and provides 62 assistance to those students who are exempt from the payment of 63 tuition and fees to assist in resolving any problems related to 64 such exemption. The liaisons shall provide such students with 65 on-campus support and must be employees of the program, 66 institution, or university.

67 <u>1.</u> The name and contact information of the liaison must
68 be:

69 <u>a.1.</u> Provided to each student who is exempt from the
70 payment of tuition and fees and who is attending that program,
71 institution, or university.

72 <u>b.</u>2. Published on the website of the program, institution,

74 <u>c.</u><sup>3.</sup> Provided to the department and each community-based 75 care lead agency.

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76	2. The liaison shall provide such students with on-campus
77	support, including, but not limited to, all of the following:
78	a. Assistance with identifying and applying for any
79	tuition waivers or exemptions for which the student is eligible.
80	b. Assistance with identifying and applying for other
81	available financial aid options for which the student is
82	eligible.
83	c. Academic advising tailored to the individual needs of
84	the student, considering the populations to which he or she
85	belongs.
86	d. Referrals, as appropriate, to support services offered
87	by the program, Florida College System institution, state
88	university, or community-based partners.
89	(b) Each school district program, Florida College System
90	institution, and state university must maintain the original
91	documentation submitted by the student regarding his or her
92	eligibility for the tuition and fee exemption under s. 1009.25
93	and may not make additional requests for such documentation.
94	(2) A school district program, Florida College System
95	institution, or state university may also provide campus
96	coaching services and other support to a student who is exempt
97	from the payment of tuition and fees under s. 1009.25 to promote
98	his or her successful completion of postsecondary education and
99	transition to independent living.
100	(3)(a) The Department of Education and the Board of
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101	Governors of the State University System shall, in consultation
102	with the State Office on Homelessness within the Department of
103	Children and Families, develop best practices and training
104	materials for all employees of each school district program,
105	Florida College System institution, and state university for the
106	purpose of:
107	1. Identifying students experiencing, or at risk of
108	experiencing, homelessness.
109	2. Referring such students to the program, institution, or
110	university's liaison.
111	3. Raising awareness among all students of available
112	services and supports for such population of students.
113	(b) Each school district program, Florida College System
114	institution, and state university must:
115	1. Annually provide electronically the best practices and
116	training materials to all employees.
117	2. Annually provide electronically awareness materials to
118	students.
119	3. Post awareness materials in public places on its
120	campuses, including students unions and libraries.
121	(4) Each Florida College System institution and state
122	university shall, in consultation with the State Office on
123	Homelessness within the Department of Children and Families,
124	develop plans for prioritizing the placement of students
125	experiencing homelessness or at risk of experiencing

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126	homelessness, including, but not limited to, students eligible
127	for the tuition and fee exemption under s. 1009.25(1)(e), in
128	residence halls and dormitory residences owned by the
129	institution or university.
130	(5) If a Florida College System institution or state
131	university implements a priority system for the assignment of
132	students to or the award of any of the following, the
133	institution or university must provide students eligible for the
134	tuition and fee exemption under s. 1009.25(1)(e) with first
135	priority given to:
136	(a) Institution-operated or university-operated housing.
137	(b) Year-round housing.
138	(c) Work-study opportunities.
139	(6) Each Florida College System institution and state
140	university is encouraged to develop payment plans for housing
141	and other expenses with payments that coincide with the
142	disbursement of financial aid, including grants, loans, and
143	work-study income for students experiencing homelessness or at
144	risk of experiencing homelessness, including, but not limited
145	to, students eligible for the tuition and fee exemption under s.
146	<u>1009.25(1)(e).</u>
147	<u>(7)</u> The Chancellors of the Division of Career and Adult
148	Education, the Florida College System, and the State University
149	System shall report annually to the department specific data,
150	subject to privacy laws, about the students who are exempt from
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151 the payment of tuition and fees under s. 1009.25(1)(e) served by 152 the campus liaisons, including academic progress, retention 153 rates for students enrolled in the program, financial aid 154 requested and received, and information required by the National 155 Youth in Transition Database. The report must also include the 156 retention and graduation rates of recipients of grants from the 157 Fostering Independence Grant Program under s. 1009.702 as a 158 distinct group within the report. 159 Section 2. 180	1009.702 Fostering Independence Grant Program
181	(1) ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE The Fostering Independence
182	Grant Program is established within the Department of Education
183	to ensure that the costs associated with attending a Florida
184	College System institution or state university are not a barrier
185	to education for eligible former foster youth and students
186	experiencing homelessness. The program shall be administered by
187	participating Florida College System institutions and state
188	universities pursuant to State Board of Education rules and
189	Board of Governors regulations.
190	(2) ELIGIBILITYTo be eligible for a grant, a student
191	<u>must:</u>
192	(a) Be eligible for the tuition and fee exemption under s.
193	1009.25(1)(c) 14 or (e).
194	(b) Be a resident for tuition purposes pursuant to s.
195	1009.21.
196	(c) Have earned a standard high school diploma under s.
197	1002.3105(5), s. 1003.4281, or s. 1003.4282 or its equivalent
198	<u>under s. 1003.435.</u>
199	(d) Be enrolled for at least 9 credit hours per semester,
200	or the equivalent, in a degree program, a certificate program,
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201	or an applied technology program at a Florida College System
202	institution or state university.
203	(e) Have submitted a Free Application for Federal Student
204	Aid which is complete and accurate before the disbursement of
205	grant funds and met the eligibility requirements of s. 1009.50
206	for demonstrated financial need for the Florida Public Student
207	Assistance Grant Program.
208	(3) GRANT AWARDSubject to legislative appropriation, the
209	award amount to each student shall be based on the student's
210	unmet need after any federal, state, and institutional financial
211	aid has been applied, including, but not limited to, a Pell
212	Grant or Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program award. A
213	student is eligible to receive a maximum award equal to the
214	amount needed to cover 100 percent of the estimated annual cost
215	of attendance for the student to attend the Florida College
216	System institution or state university after all federal, state,
217	and institutional financial aid has been applied.
218	(4) REPORTING REQUIREMENTSEach Florida College System
219	institution and state university must annually report the
220	retention and graduation rates of recipients of a grant under
221	this section pursuant to s. 409.1452.
222	(5) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCEThe department shall contract
223	with a not-for-profit entity with experience supporting the
224	educational success of youth experience homelessness and youth
225	who are aging out of foster care to provide technical assistance
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226	to Florida College System institutions and state universities,
227	state agencies, service providers, homeless service providers,
228	and residential programs whose students may be eligible to
229	participate in the grant program.
230	(6) The State Board of Education and the Board of
231	Governors shall adopt rules and regulations, respectively, to
232	administer this section.
233	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.

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
