minimum of 30 days of house arrest, and attend a department-approved driver improvement course relating to the rights of vulnerable road users relative to vehicles on the roadway as provided in s. 322.0261(2). The court shall also revoke the person's driver license for at least 30 days.

- (3) A person who commits a moving violation that causes the death of a vulnerable road user commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s.

  775.083, and, upon conviction, shall pay a fine of not less than \$5,000, serve a minimum of 180 days of house arrest, and attend a department-approved driver improvement course relating to the rights of vulnerable road users relative to vehicles on the roadway as provided in s. 322.0261(2). The court shall also revoke the person's driver license for at least 1 year.
- (4) As used in this section, the term "vulnerable road user" has the same meaning as in s. 316.027(1).
- (5) This section does not prohibit a person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
