Professional learning instruction to assist teachers in improving classroom instruction and in meeting certification or 42 43 recertification requirements. 2. Instruction to assist potential and existing substitute 44 45 teachers in performing their duties. 46 3. Instruction to assist paraprofessionals in meeting 47 education and training requirements. 48 4. Instruction for baccalaureate degree holders to become 49 certified teachers as provided in this section in order to increase routes to the classroom for professionals who hold a 50

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51 baccalaureate degree and college graduates who were not 52 education majors. 53 5. Instruction and professional learning for part-time and 54 full-time nondegreed teachers of career programs under s. 55 1012.39(1)(c). 56 6. Instruction that does not distort significant 57 historical events or include a curriculum or instruction that teaches identity politics, violates s. 1000.05, or is based on 58 59 theories that systemic racism, sexism, oppression, and privilege 60 are inherent in the institutions of the United States and were created to maintain social, political, and economic inequities. 61 Courses and instruction within the educator preparation 62 institute must afford candidates the opportunity to think 63 64 critically, achieve mastery of academic program content, learn instructional strategies, and demonstrate competence. 65 66 Section 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (8) of section 1012.56, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as paragraph (c), 67 68 paragraph (a) of subsection (7) is amended, and a new paragraph 69 (b) is added to subsection (8) of that section, to read: 70 1012.56 Educator certification requirements.-71 (7) TYPES AND TERMS OF CERTIFICATION. -The Department of Education shall issue a professional 72 (a) certificate for a period not to exceed 5 years to any applicant 73 74 who fulfills one of the following: 75 1. Meets all the applicable requirements outlined in Page 3 of 6

91 e. Achieves a passing score on the Florida professional92 education competency examination required by state board rule.

Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2) (a) -94 (h) and completes a professional learning certification program 95 approved by the department pursuant to paragraph (8)(c) (8)(b) 96 or an educator preparation institute approved by the department pursuant to s. 1004.85. An applicant who completes one of these 97 98 programs and is rated highly effective as determined by his or 99 her performance evaluation under s. 1012.34 is not required to take or achieve a passing score on the professional education 100

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101 competency examination in order to be awarded a professional 102 certificate. 103 104 At least 1 year before an individual's temporary certificate is 105 set to expire, the department shall electronically notify the individual of the date on which his or her certificate will 106 107 expire and provide a list of each method by which the qualifications for a professional certificate can be completed. 108 109 (8) PROFESSIONAL LEARNING CERTIFICATION PROGRAM.-(b) Professional learning certification program courses: 110 1. May not distort significant historical events or 111 include curriculum or instruction that teaches identity 112 politics, violates s. 1000.05, or is based on theories that 113 114 systemic racism, sexism, oppression, and privilege are inherent 115 in the institutions of the United States and were created to 116 maintain social, political, and economic inequities. 117 2. Must afford candidates the opportunity to think 118 critically, achieve mastery of academic program content, learn 119 instructional strategies, and demonstrate competence. 120 Section 4. Subsection (4) of section 1012.562, Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (5), and a new subsection 121 (4) is added to that section, to read: 122 123 1012.562 Public accountability and state approval of 124 school leader preparation programs. - The Department of Education 125 shall establish a process for the approval of Level I and Level

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126 II school leader preparation programs that will enable aspiring 127 school leaders to obtain their certificate in educational 128 leadership under s. 1012.56. School leader preparation programs 129 must be competency-based, aligned to the principal leadership 130 standards adopted by the state board, and open to individuals 131 employed by public schools, including charter schools and 132 virtual schools. Level I programs lead to initial certification in educational leadership for the purpose of preparing 133 134 individuals to serve as school administrators. Level II programs 135 build upon Level I training and lead to renewal certification as 136 a school principal.

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(4) PROGRAM PROHIBITIONS; REQUIREMENTS. -

138 (a) School leader preparation programs may not distort 139 significant historical events or include curriculum or 140 instruction that teaches identity politics, violates s. 1000.05, 141 or is based on theories that systemic racism, sexism, 142 oppression, and privilege are inherent in the institutions of 143 the United States and were created to maintain social, 144 political, and economic inequities. 145 (b) School leader preparation programs must afford 146 candidates the opportunity to demonstrate mastery of program 147 content, including instructional leadership strategies, coaching 148 development, school safety, and continuous improvement efforts. 149 Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.

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
