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11	Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section
12	1006.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

14	discipline and school safetyThe district school board shall
15	provide for the proper accounting for all students, for the
16	attendance and control of students at school, and for proper
17	attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the
18	welfare of students, including:
19	(1) CONTROL OF STUDENTS
20	(a) Adopt rules for the control, discipline, in-school
21	suspension, suspension, and expulsion of students and decide all
22	cases recommended for expulsion. <u>A student in kindergarten</u>
23	through grade 3 may not be suspended and a student in
24	kindergarten through grade 12 may not be expelled for willful
25	disobedience, open defiance of authority of a school staff, or
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26	substantially disrupting the orderly conduct of the school.
27	Suspension hearings are exempted from the provisions of chapter
28	120. Expulsion hearings shall be governed by ss. 120.569 and
29	120.57(2) and are exempt from s. 286.011. However, the student's
30	parent must be given notice of the provisions of s. 286.011 and
31	may elect to have the hearing held in compliance with that
32	section. The district school board may prohibit the use of
33	corporal punishment, if the district school board adopts or has
34	adopted a written program of alternative control or discipline.
35	Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section

40	(c) The principal or the principal's designee may
41	recommend to the district school superintendent the expulsion of
42	any student who has committed a serious breach of conduct,
43	including, but not limited to, willful disobedience, open
44	defiance of authority of a member of his or her staff, violence
45	against persons or property <del>, or any other act which</del>
46	substantially disrupts the orderly conduct of the school. A
47	recommendation of expulsion or assignment to a second chance
48	school may also be made for any student found to have
49	intentionally made false accusations that jeopardize the
50	professional reputation, employment, or professional
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51 certification of a teacher or other member of the school staff, 52 according to the district school board code of student conduct. 53 Any recommendation of expulsion shall include a detailed report 54 by the principal or the principal's designated representative on 55 the alternative measures taken prior to the recommendation of 56 expulsion.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.

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
