40	athletic contests, practices, workouts, and conditioning
41	sessions. The training must include completion of a course in
42	cardiopulmonary resuscitation or a basic first aid course that
43	includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and
44	demonstrated proficiency in the use of a defibrillator. Each
45	employee <u>, coach,</u> or volunteer who is reasonably expected to use

The course is authored or approved by at least 10 health care professionals, including doctors of medicine, 85 doctors of osteopathy, registered nurses, physical therapists, 86 and certified athletic trainers. 87 8. The course is revised and reviewed for updates at least 88 89 once every 30 months. The course is available to the general public for a 90 9. 91 retail price under \$50. 92 Each course examination is automated and taken online 10. 93 with a score of 80 percent or better for successful completion. 94 Section 5.
