5 Remove lines 22-50 and insert:

6 a. Fifty hours of training in business or public
7 administration, business or public management, or emergency
8 management or preparedness. A bachelor's degree may be
9 substituted for this training requirement.

10 b. Four years of verifiable experience in comprehensive
11 emergency management services that includes improving
12 preparedness for emergency and disaster protection, prevention,
13 mitigation, response, and recovery, with direct supervisory
14 responsibility for responding to at least 1 emergency or
15 disaster.

16 I. A master's degree in emergency preparedness or

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17 management, business or public administration, communications,
18 finance, homeland security, public health, criminal justice,
19 meteorology, or environmental science may be substituted for 2
20 of the years of experience required in this sub-subparagraph but
21 not for the required supervisory experience.

22 II. A valid accreditation as a Certified Master Exercise
23 Practitioner through the Federal Emergency Management Agency,
24 Certified Emergency Manager through the International
25 Association of Emergency Managers, or Florida Professional
26 Emergency Manager through the Florida Professional Emergency
27 Preparedness Association may be substituted for the requirements
28 of this sub-subparagraph. A certification used as a substitution
29 for the requirements of this sub-subparagraph must be currently
30 maintained in good standing at all times until the actual time
31 and experience requirements satisfying this sub-subparagraph are
32 met by the appointee.

33 c. Completion of 150 hours in comprehensive emergency
34 management training provided through or approved by the Federal
35 Emergency Management Agency or its successor, including
36 completion of the following National Incident Management System
37 courses, or equivalent courses established by the Federal
38 Emergency Management Agency through the Emergency Management
39 Institute:

40 I. ICS-100: Introduction to the Incident Command System;

41 II. ICS-200: ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action

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42 Incidents;

43 III. ICS-300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents;

44 IV. ICS-400: Advanced ICS for Command and General Staff;

45 V. IS-700: National Incident Management System, An

46 Introduction; and

47 VI. IS-800: National Response Framework, An Introduction.

50 completed no earlier than the 10 years preceding the date of
