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Civil Aviation Organization standards for such airport.

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- (1), the airport authority may impose the following requirements for a private aircraft that weighs at least 75,000 pounds but not more than 125,000 pounds:
- (a) Such aircraft's landing frequency and timelines may not exceed 20 landings per year and may not interfere with daytime airport operations.
- (b) Landing fees for such aircraft may be higher than landing fees for other aircraft.
- (c) The operator of the aircraft must pay for appropriate hangar and storage facilities.
- (3) Before initial landing at an airport owned or operated by the airport authority, and annually thereafter, the airport authority may require the operator of a private aircraft to provide documentation that the requirements imposed under this section have been met.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
