17	(3)(a) If a secure continuous remote alcohol monitor is
18	required as a condition of release, the defendant's release may
19	not be delayed more than 2 hours after the oral pronouncement of
20	the order if the defendant is to be released on his or her own
21	recognizance or, if there is a monetary component to the
22	release, more than 2 hours after the defendant's bail or bond is
23	posted.
24	(b) A requirement of a secure continuous remote alcohol
25	monitor vendor to have a cosignor for the monitoring device or
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payment from a person other than the defendant may not delay the

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release.

Such a vendor requirement must be established no later than 24 hours after the defendant's (c) A secure continuous remote alcohol monitor may not be required for a first misdemeanor offense unless it is shown by clear and convincing evidence that such a monitor is required to protect the public safety. (4) Notwithstanding any other law, a defendant may not be required to surrender a license to carry a concealed weapon or concealed firearm in conjunction with a first misdemeanor offense unless it appears that the defendant would present a danger to the public if he or she were to possess the concealed weapon or concealed firearm. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.

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
