14	equipment to show or display blue lights, except the following:
15	(a) Police vehicles <u>;</u>
16	(b) Government-owned fire department vehicles, except

18	a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 24,000 pounds if
19	authorized in writing by the fire chief of the government agency
20	and if shown or displayed only on the rear of such vehicles;

23	of Corrections or any county correctional agency may show or

26 including vehicles of volunteer firefighters as permitted under 27 s. 316.2398, may show or display red or red and white lights. 28 <u>However, blue lights may be shown or displayed on fire</u> 29 department vehicles in accordance with paragraph (2)(b).

30 (b) Vehicles of medical staff physicians or technicians of 31 medical facilities licensed by the state or of volunteer 32 ambulance services as authorized under s. 316.2398, ambulances 33 as authorized under this chapter, and buses and taxicabs as 34 authorized under s. 316.2399 may show or display red lights.

35 Vehicles of the fire department and $_{\tau}$ fire patrol, (C) 36 police vehicles, and such ambulances and emergency vehicles of municipal and county departments, volunteer ambulance services, 37 public service corporations operated by private corporations, 38 39 the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Department of 40 Environmental Protection, the Department of Transportation, the 41 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the 42 Department of Corrections as are designated or authorized by 43 their respective department or the chief of police of an 44 incorporated city or any sheriff of any county may operate 45 emergency lights and sirens in an emergency.

51 specific authorization of a law enforcement officer or law 52 enforcement agency. Wreckers must use amber rotating or flashing 53 lights while performing recoveries and loading on the roadside 54 day or night, and may use such lights while towing a vehicle on 55 wheel lifts, slings, or under reach if the operator of the 56 wrecker deems such lights necessary. A flatbed, car carrier, or 57 rollback may not use amber rotating or flashing lights when 58 hauling a vehicle on the bed unless it creates a hazard to other 59 motorists because of protruding objects. Further, escort vehicles may show or display amber lights when in the actual 60 61 process of escorting overdimensioned equipment, material, or 62 buildings as authorized by law.

63 <u>(e)</u> Vehicles owned or leased by private security agencies 64 may show or display green and amber lights, with either color 65 being no greater than 50 percent of the lights displayed, while 66 the security personnel are engaged in security duties on private 67 or public property.
